Letter from the Rector

Follow the star?

Dear friends,

How do you view the arrival of 2023? Maybe you see the New Year as a fresh opportunity to turn over a new leaf, and like to make a resolution to change something about the way you live. Or maybe you have things to which you are especially looking forward during the coming year.

While we may have dates noted in our diaries and calendars for 2023, doubtless other things will happen during the year that we will not expect, and which may - or may not - be welcome.

Who could have predicted how things would have turned out during last year? Some things may have been good. For example, my wife Mary and I were delighted by the arrival of our granddaughter Eleanor at the start of December.

However, many things happened in our world which were not good. Think of the war started by Russia through its invasion of Ukraine. The ripple effects of this conflict has fuelled the cost of living crisis, and many are now struggling with food and fuel poverty in our own nation.

Again, during last year we were saddened by the death of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, who was such a source of stability in changing times, and a shining example of service.


