It's all about trees this month!

The Old Stables, 13 Goadby Road, Waltham on the Wolds - reference 23/00504/TCA
 Japanese maple crown raised to approximately 1.5 metres as it is very low to the garden and more light is needed underneath. Conifer reduction by 2.5 metres as it is getting too tall for its location.

St Egelwin Church, Church Street, Scalford - reference 23/00551/TCA

Corsican pine - remove major dead wood. Scots pine - remove major dead wood and raise the crown to 2.4m to allow access/ground maintenance. Sycamore - raise the crown to 2.4m to allow access/ground maintenance. Scots Pine - dead wood and clear away from the church building by 3m. Corsican pine - remove major dead wood.

5 day notice: Silver birch tree is dangerously rotten at the base and crown brake and must be felled immediately.

Letter from the Rector

'One more Step' - Endings and Beginnings

Dear friends,

Our lives are marked by many different 'endings' and 'beginnings'. These are important moments of transition, from the old and familiar to the new and unfamiliar.

Whether it's moving home, leaving or starting a job, retiring, getting married, ending a relationship, ill health, or loss through bereavement, our lives are often punctuated by significant endings and beginnings.

This marking might include a gathering with speeches, gifts and cards, and maybe a service with special prayers or symbolic acts. The event seeks to express the meaning of the moment, and an appreciation of the person (or people) at the centre of the gathering.

For example, during this month our two primary schools in Scalford and Waltham will hold their annual leavers' service. During this service, Year 6 children will share memories of their time at the school, and how they are feeling about moving on. The rest of the school community then say farewell to the leavers, thank them for their contribution to the life of the school, and pray for them.

It is always a very moving occasion, one where both smiles and tears are never far away, and a good supply of tissues needs to be close at hand!


This year, we will also be marking two other important endings and beginnings in the life of our schools. The Headteacher of Scalford

School, Marie Waring, and the Executive Headteacher of the group of schools including Waltham, Julie Hopkins, are both retiring at the end of this term. We shall be joining with others in giving thanks for their leadership over many years, and wishing them every joy and blessing in their retirement. We also pray for Melanie Wrightam and Hollie Geeson, who succeed them at Scalford and Waltham Schools.

One of the hymns often sung at leavers services - and indeed at other services like christenings, weddings and funerals - is 'One More Step' by Sydney Carter. This hymn pictures life as a journey, and is a prayer that we might know God's presence with us along the way. The chorus of the hymn puts it in these words:

Keep me travelling along with you.*

Saturday, 9th September**

Ride & Stride is a sponsored event on the second Saturday in September every year, and is the single largest source of income for the Leicester Historic Churches Trust. It's also a church open day and a great day for getting out and about in Leicestershire.



Ride & Stride 2022 raised £34,559, half of which goes to the church of the rider's/walker's choice, the remaining half to the HCPT. The Trust's share of the funds raised, which includes Gift Aid claimed by the Trust, is used to give grants to churches and chapels.

They fund a wide range of projects, including roof repairs and renewals (and roof alarms), repointing of stonework, conservation of organs and stained glass windows, and projects to enable greater community use of the building.
