Letter from the Rector

D-Day 80, and the cost of liberation

Dear friends,,

Eighty years ago, a force from 13 countries approached Normandy in a 5000-vessel armada. In the early hours of 6th June 1944, 24,000 paratroopers and glider-borne troops landed behind German lines to provide tactical support.

Massive naval and aerial bombardments attempted to suppress the German defences and weaponry. Then a ground force of more than 130,000 troops came ashore on five beaches across a 540-mile stretch of Normandy coast, with the first waves often facing intact defences.

By the end of D-Day - the first day of Operation Overlord - there had been 10,000 allied casualties. Yet this was only the beginning. The ensuing Battle of Normandy was to last into August, and cost tens of thousands of lives as it defeated the occupying German forces.

It was a decisive success for the Allies, and it paved the way for the liberation of much of north west Europe.

This month - and especially around the anniversary of D-Day - there are different events happening across our villages commemorating D-Day. While few remain who took part in those decisive events, many of us will know of those from our village communities who once did, including those who made the ultimate sacrifice in the costly struggle for liberation.

The stories told by those who lived through D-Day speak of how they shared in a hellish experience, and they help us to realise the harsh reality of war.

People such as Harry Marrington who landed on Omaha Beach as a 19 year old British sailor. He described his memories of D-Day as follows: "All hell broke loose and everyone tried to find shelter ... There were terrible sights ... I thought how mad it is that people can do this to each other".

Sadly we human beings fail to learn the lessons of history. The daily news reminds us that human conflict continues to cause great suffering, and of how many still share the hellish experience of war.

Yet it need not be so. Even in the darkness, there is the light of hope - hope of a world finally at peace. Christians believe that, in Jesus Christ, God has come to make true and lasting peace possible.

Through His death on a cross and resurrection from the dead, Jesus has won the decisive victory over evil and death, once and for all. In that God-given assurance, we can be inspired to play our part - like those we remember on the anniversary of D-Day - in the struggle against whatever evil confront us, knowing that the ultimate victory has already been won.

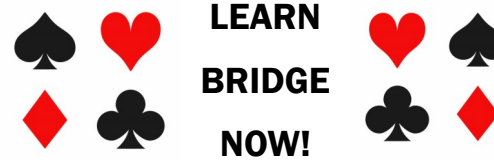

The restored Eastwell Iron Ore Co. locomotive 'Lord Granby' will be on display on 2nd June. Eastwell History Group has negotiated with Amberley Museum in West Sussex for the long term loan of the last known remaining truck (tram) from the ironstone days. When the quarrying of ironstone was discontinued, much of the asset, viz 'Lord Granby', was distributed around various preservation bodies. After some expert sleuthing, the tram was tracked down and it should be back home shortly.

- Thursday, 5th September: A talk by Matthew Morris of ULAS on the excavations recently undertaken at Leicester Cathedral.** Over the past three years, archaeologists from University of Leicester Archaeological Services (ULAS) have been working with Leicester Cathedral to reveal the story of the 9009 year old church and the Roman city buries beneath it. The excavations, carried out before construction of a new Heritage Learning Centre in the Cathedral Gardens, have resulted in a remarkable archaeological archive of regional and national significance. Discoveries include a highly unusual, continuous 850 year sequence of burial activity, as well as Anglo-Saxon, Roman and prehistoric activity dating back over 15,000 years. The results have the potential to tell powerful and engaging stories about Leicester's past, which will capture your imagination.
- Thursday, 10th October: A talk by John S Thomas of ULAS on the Iron Age hill fort at Burrough Hill.** Burrough Hill is an Iron Age hillfort seven miles south of Melton Mowbray. The site commands views over the surrounding countryside for miles around. There has been human activity in the area since at least the Mesolithic, and the hillfort was founded in the early Iron Age (1200 BC to 500 BC). Various excavations have recorded parts of the ramparts, a 'guard chamber', Iron Age/early Roman pits in the fort's interior and roundhouses in the northern part of the fort. John will explain in detail the work that has been undertaken in recent years to learn more about this important site.

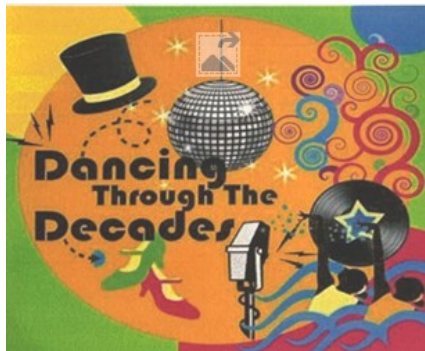

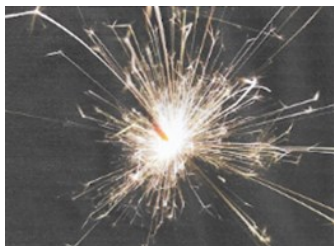
