

- Thursday, 10th October: A talk by John S Thomas of ULAS on the Iron Age hill fort at Burrough Hill. Burrough Hill is an Iron Age hillfort seven miles south of Melton Mowbray. The site commands views over the surrounding countryside for miles around. There has been human activity in the area since at least the Mesolithic, and the hillfort was founded in the early Iron Age (1200 BC to 500 BC). Various excavations have recorded parts of the ramparts, a 'quard chamber', Iron Age/early Roman pits in the fort's interior and roundhouses in the northern part of the fort. John will explain in detail the work that has been undertaken in recent years to learn more about this important site.

Future Events

Thursday, 5th September: A talk by Matthew Morris of ULAS on the excavations recently undertaken at Leicester Cathedral. Over the past three years,



archaeologists from University of Leicester Archaeological Services (ULAS) have been working with Leicester Cathedral to reveal the story of the 9009 year old church and the Roman city buries beneath it. The excavations, carried out before construction of a new Heritage Learning Centre in the Cathedral Gardens, have resulted in a remarkable archaeological archive of regional and national significance. Discoveries include a highly unusual, continuous 850 year sequence of burial activity, as well as Anglo-Saxon, Roman and prehis-

toric activity dating back over 15,000 years. The results have the potential to tell powerful and engaging stories about Leicester's past, which will capture your imagination.

Letter from the Rector

Praying for our leaders ...

Dear friends,,

This month begins with the General Election on 4th July. Whoever is elected, and whichever party (or parties) forms the next government, there will certainly be many changes. For example, we shall have a new MP elected to serve in our new constituency of Melton and Syston.

As well as all the changes, the General Election also comes at a challenging time for our world. A few weeks ago, when calling the General Election, the Prime Minister Rishi Sunak declared: 'Now is the moment for Britain to choose its future. This election will take place at a time when the world is more dangerous than at any time since the Cold War'. And in response, Labour leader Keir Starmer addressed voters, stating 'It will feel like a long campaign but, no matter what else is said and done, that opportunity for change is what this election is about'.

At this time of change and challenge, what - if anything - do we hope for from our newly elected leaders? For example, do they have a vision for our nation which articulates what a good society should look like, and policies which can then turn that vision into reality?

Only time will tell, but whoever is in government will certainly face considerable financial constraints and have to make many difficult choices.

Paul Woolley (CEO at the *London Institute for Contemporary Christianity*) recently wrote that "the state of our politics reflects the state

of our souls. ... Politics is about organising our common life, and participating in it is an act of neighbourly love".

How might we participate? As well as exercising our democratic right to vote, we can pray for our nation and its leaders. As St Paul puts it, "The first thing I want you to do is pray. Pray every way you know how, for everyone you know. Pray especially for rulers and their governments to rule well so we can be quietly about our business of living simply, in humble contemplation. This is the way our Saviour God wants us to live" (1 Timothy 2.1,2 *The Message*).

Here is a prayer for our nation and our leaders:


God of hope, in these times of change and challenge,
