Fact 1: At present there are 8903 other Parish Councils.

Fact 2: Collectively this year (2024-25) they will collect (precept) £783 million from their ratepayers (but they will probably spend in excess of their precepts)

Fact 3: On average each Band D ratepayer will pay just over £88 this year to their local Parish Council.

Fact 4: Eaton Parish Council's 2024-25 precept was £26,000.

Therefore each £1000 of that precept will cost a Band D Council Taxpayer a very small sum (pence) per week.

Assumption: Over time more and more activities previously carried out at either (Melton) Borough Council level or (Leicestershire) County Council level will lapse because of financial pressures.

Does a parish council pick up the pieces where it can? Eaton Parish Council makes the assumption that this is the conundrum it will face in the future and to that end its yearly budget must be robust and be part of a longer term financial plan.

Therefore it proposes to adopt a grants policy at its September meeting and a draft of this can be seen on the website attached to the July minutes. The important point to note is that Eaton Parish Council will continue its best efforts to support all parish groups and their financial requests BUT these must be known by the end of November at the latest in order to be considered in the following year's precept calculation.

Thursday, 5th September, 7./30 pm in Eastwell Village Hall. Entrance free to paid-up members and under 16s, £4 to non-members. A talk by Matthew Morris of ULAS on the excavations recently undertaken at Leicester Cathedral. Over the past three years, archaeologists from University of Leicester Archaeological Services (ULAS) have been working with Leicester Cathedral to reveal the story of



the 900 year old church and the Roman city buries beneath it. The excavations, carried out before construction of a new Heritage Learning Centre in the Cathedral Gardens, have resulted in a remarkable archaeological archive of regional and national significance. Discoveries include a highly unusual, continuous 850 year sequence of burial activity, as well as Anglo-Saxon, Roman and prehistoric activity dating back over 15,000 years. The results have the potential to tell powerful and engaging stories about Leicester's

past, which will capture your imagination.

- Thursday, 10th October, 7.30 pm in Eastwell Village Hall. Entrance free to paid-up members and under 16s, £4 to non-members. A talk by John S Thomas of ULAS on the Iron Age hill fort at Burrough Hill. Burrough Hill is an Iron Age hillfort seven miles south of Melton Mowbray. Situated on a promontory about 210 metres above sea level, the site commands views over the surrounding countryside for miles around. There has been human activity in the area since at least the Mesolithic and the hillfort was founded in the early Iron Age (1200 BC to 500 BC). The hillfort seems to have been built in the Middle Iron Age and continued in use until at least the early Roman period. Various excavations have recorded parts of the ramparts, a 'guard chamber', Iron Age/early Roman pits in the fort's interior and roundhouses in the northern part of the fort. John will explain in detail the work that has been undertaken in recent years to learn more about this important site.

This important meeting gives all members and supporters the opportunity to see how the history group is managed and to make suggestions for the future activities. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Letter from the Rector

Running the race of life

Dear friends,

From 24th July to 11th August, the 2024 Summer Olympics are being held in Paris. Athletes are competing across thirty two sports, striving to achieve success and win a gold medal.

In preparation for these Olympics, competitors have had to make sacrifices in order to represent their country to the best of their ability - eg. by committing themselves to undergo a strict training programme.

One hundred years ago, in the 1924 Paris Olympics, a faithful Scotsman showed that there are even greater sacrifices worth making for ultimate glory. Eric Liddell was born in 1902 in China to Scottish missionaries, and he made an early commitment to follow Jesus Christ.

He took his faith seriously, believing that, because Iesus had died for him, his life should be spent serving God and other people. He was an outstanding all-round sportsman and, after playing rugby for Scotland, focused on athletics.

He was selected for the British team for the 1924 Paris Olympics with the expectation that he would run - and win - the 100 metres event.

Liddell, believing he had to respond to God's goodness to him, refused to take part in the heats held on a Sunday. He came under enormous pressure but refusing to compromise his faith, instead trained for the 200 metres and 400 metres events. After taking bronze at the 200 metres, Liddell prepared for the 400 metres, a distance over which he was not expected to do well. Yet he won, breaking the world record in the process.

You may have seen his inspiring story in the 1981 Oscar-winning film Chariots of Fire.

After the Olympics, Liddell felt called to return to China to teach in a Christian college. Soon, as war made China increasingly perilous, Liddell's children and wife - pregnant with their third child - left. Eric Liddell, committed to serving the Chinese people, stayed.

In 1943, Liddell was imprisoned in a brutal prison camp, where he became a leader helping, encouraging, teaching Bible classes, and praying for both his inmates and captors. Malnourished, his health failed. In 1945, just months before liberation, he died aged just

Eric Liddell believed that his unbreakable priority was to serve Jesus, wherever he was - whether on the track, or even in a prison camp. Every arena presents an opportunity to point others to Jesus Christ. And he was ready to make the ultimate sacrifice in following his Lord and Saviour.

Eric Liddell knew that in the race of life there is a far greater and lasting prize for which to run. As St Paul puts it: "Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They dop it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last for ever" (1 Corinthians 9.25).
