At the Parish Council on 10th March at Eastwell Village Hall Geoff Hulland and Martin Lusty from Waltham on the Wolds Parish Council talked about their experiences of preparing their Neighbourhood Plan, and a copy of their plan can be found at

https://www.eatonpc.org.uk/planning-applications.

Eaton Parish Council will continue to explore the possibility of such a Plan at the Annual Parish Meeting on 19th May at Goadby Marwood Village Hall when Gary Kirk, a Neighbourhood Planning consultant from YourLocale, will give more details of the process.

It is important to understand the relationship between a parish council and a neighbourhood planning group in this process. They are not one and the same, although it would be unusual for there not to be some overlap in personnel between the two. But it is the group which produces the plan with the help of consultants and which is then "sponsored" for approval by the relevant parish council because it is allied to the role of a parish council as a statutory consultee in all parish planning applications.

You can find a good explanation of this and more on the parish council website again at https://www.eatonpc.org.uk/planning-applications.

And, of course, the Annual Parish meeting is the opportunity for all parishioners to bring all and any of their concerns and interests to the meeting. Councillors hope to see you there?





Even with all of life's conflicts and complexities, we hold onto hope that somehow good will triumph in the end - just as we know that the sun will rise in the morning, and trust that there is light at the end of even the darkest. The message of Easter is that this can also be tunnel. Instinctively we try to hang onto hope, even when all seems hopeless.

Living Hope (www.cofe.io/livinghope) is the Church of England's theme for Lent 2025. Daily readings, reflections, and prayers encourage us to discover how, in a world where it can feel hard to be optimistic, God offers us hope that is not wishful thinking.

It is, as the Bible suggests, something alive real, robust, rooted. In the disappointment hope of Easter, of daily setbacks and the pain of deeper hurts, we are invited to discover that God is present with us through it all.

This year, Easter is on Sunday 20th April. Some of us will be up early to greet the dawning of Easter Day at 5.45 am in Stonesby.

Together with Christians across the world, we celebrate the dawning of the hope God has given us through the death and resurrection of Jesus. 


