Parishioners might remember that at two previous meetings councillors considered the possibility of an Eaton Neighbourhood Plan. Although it is yet to be confirmed at the July meeting, this venture now looks unlikely to happen.

And the reason for such a decision is important for parishioners to consider.

Namely the Government's decision to axe funding for Neighbourhood Planning. The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government's (MHCLG) has decided to stop funding for the neighbourhood planning support programme. This decision is seen as a significant setback for localism and the highly successful neighbourhood planning initiative, which saw parish and town councils at the heart of the 2,400 communities, with more than 1,000 plans approved at referendum.

Whilst various bodies such as SLCC, NALC and Locality (the membership organisation commissioned by MHCLG to deliver the support programme), are making representations to the Government the decision is unlikely to be changed.

Eaton could still pursue such a venture but would now be faced with making up the approximate £18,000 shortfall that arises from the funding cut.

But for those unfortunate parishes midway through the process of obtaining such a plan (and remember we learnt that, for example, it was a three year exercise for neighbouring Waltham on the Wolds), there is no funding available to complete their submissions (in the clerk's view a quite scandalous situation).



Minor prune of weeping birch, trim bottoms to raise the canopy and reduce any over-extended branches to create an umbrella shape; remove singular snapped out limb of section of pines and crown raise remaining to around 5m above ground level; crown raise conifer by garden shed by pool to make more room under canopy; section of dead trees including large silver birch and purple plums - remove anything declining and crown raise to allow enough room to walk under without hitting head; large cherry overhanging garden - remove single stem that hangs low into garden.

Dear Friends,

Our lives are marked by many different transitions. These are important moments, as we journey from the old and familiar to the new and unfamiliar. Whether it's moving It is always a very moving occasion, one home, leaving or starting a job, retiring, where both smiles and tears are never far getting married, ending a relationship, facing away, and a good supply of tissues needs to ill health, or experiencing loss through bereavement, our lives are punctuated by significant endings and beginnings.






