Amongst the many topics dealt with at the last Parish Council meeting on 14th July, two might be of particular interest to parishioners.

As you will know from previous posts, the Parish Council is making a concerted effort to both improve but also maintain Parish Council assets, eg. The recent work on notice boards.



There are several seats around the parish in need of some drastic TLC, if not, even replacement—for example that on the approach into Goadby Marwood.

If these are beyond economic repair, then what will be their replacement and thereby hangs the dilemma. Where is the choice made between financial stringency and aesthetic appeal.

For example, should we go for that in the picture rather than a traditional wood affair?

Or should it be a cheaper but longer lasting 'plastic' type?

The Parish Council would welcome your ideas and possible sources. Why not come to the next Parish Council meeting to say so ...hint!

Also at the meeting several comments were made about problems on the roads: for example, the cleaning of gutters. A formal complaint to the County Council will, I'm sure, provoke the same response—namely that they have a rota which is maintained.

But that may not be a satisfactory response to you, even if believed?

So please complain On the Leicestershire County Council website at Report a road problem | Leicestershire County Council.

This is not just for Parish Councils; anyone can make a complaint and then track the progress of the outcome. Sometimes you might have to say it several times and certainly pictures of the problem attached to the complaint seems to speed up the process. But our experience is that it does work.



Letter from the Rector

Thirsty ground ...

Dear Friends,

Climate breakdown is causing havoc with the weather. While some parts of the world are suffering devastating floods, other places - like our own region - have experience months with very little rain.

After one of the driest Springs on record, many of our rivers and reservoirs are now running low, and some parts of the country including Leicestershire - are already in an official state of Summertime drought.

This prolonged spell of dry weather affects the timing and quality of the harvest gathered by farmers. The impact has also been evident in our gardens, not least with wilting plants and dry brittle grass.

Perhaps by the time you read this, the situation will have changed; but even so, it will
take a considerable amount of rain to replenish the depleted reservoirs, and to soften the
hard, dry ground.
"Whoever drinks the water live will become in them a spring up to eternal life" (John 4.14).

While we may grumble at having to be more careful in our use of water, other parts of the world are faring so much worse. Several regions - the Horn of Africa and Southern Africa, for example - are experiencing the worst drought for many years, which has led to millions of people enduring devastating widespread famine.

Aid organisations, including Christian chari-

ties like Tearfund, are issuing urgent appeals both for our prayers and for financial donations to help to bring some relief to communities bearing the brunt of climate related crises, as well as other causes of poverty.

In the dry and thirsty lands of the Bible, rain is seen as a God-given blessing. And it is also an image of the spiritual blessing that God longs to give whenever people acknowledge their need. When David was in the parched wilderness of Judah, he cried out to the Lord: 'O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water' (Psalm 63.1).

Christians believe that as we turn to Jesus Christ, we find in Him all that we need to soften our hard hearts and to quench our deepest spiritual thirst. Jesus says this to all who hear His voice and come to Him in faith: "Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4.14).

re-Covid, copies of these pages were printed for every household in the our villages, and all costs were covered by voluntary donation.

Post-Covid printing was resumed, and hard copies are available for those who prefer them - although the vast majority continue to be sent out via email.

However, printing involves costs, and the church offered - over the short term, I believe - to subsidise it as necessary.

Also, pre-Covid, we charged for advertisements for businesses, but post-Covid no charges have been raised.

However, It has now been decided to regulate them somewhat, print six per page (the size of the yellow block to the left) and charge £12.00 per year. They will be headed "Local businesses".

Larger spaces may be used, but will be in multiples of the yellow block, ie. double the width, but the same depth, would be £24.00; double both width and depth would use 2/3rds of a page and four spaces, etc.

Maybe those who presently run a business advertisement could let me know if they'd like to continue, how much space they'd like, and if possible, let me have either the text to be included or a ready-prepared notice, as soon as possible. We'll see how it pans out and settles down over the remainder of this year, and then charges can start in January for the calendar year. Thank you.
