Hopefully most parishioners are aware of the significant changes coming the way of all local councils courtesy of the Government's desire from the **English Devolution and Community Empowerment Bill** to have unitary authorities with a target population of half a million. Currently all the local and county authorities in Leicestershire have their proposals for how the new future might take shape.

Certainly Melton Borough Council will change and indeed may not have a reconstituted presence in Melton itself.

More worryingly for the 10,500 parish and town councils in the country, not a lot has been said about their future role and influence,, but logically the link between Eaton Parish Council and the new unitary council will be less direct and physically probably more remote.

Therefore parishioners might want to be aware of and follow the meetings that now take place in the form of the Vale Parishes Group, who recently had their meeting on 11th August at Croxton Village Hall. (Cllr) Simon Tong is the main link between Eaton Parish Council and this forum and will be glad to keep you up to date on its actions. You might remember the considerable success it has had recently in moderating the problems caused by various festivals in the Vale.

Community Orchard

The village has two allotment sites, one on Spinney Road by the disused railway bridge known as Horsepool allotments and the other one behind Stonestyle Gardens at the end of Sandy Lane. Back in 2023 the Parish Council decided to repurpose a small section of the Stonestyle allotments that had remained unused for a number of years and create a Community Orchard. The area was cleared of brambles, nettles and rubbish and fourteen apple trees of different varieties were planted. This year the trees are bearing their first fruit, however they will not be ready for the community to harvest fruit from for probably another couple of years but when they are ready we will let everyone know.

Letter from the Rector

The time of our life ...

Dear Friends,

VILLAGE NEWS

Whether it is on 1st or 22nd September, the season of autumn begins during this month. As schools start their new academic year, and harvest festivals mark the passing of another stage in the agricultural cycle, September highlights how our life contains a series of endings and beginnings.

It can also remind us of the passing of time - something that I remember towards the end of this month, when I have my birthday - how quickly time flies!

Writing thousands of years ago, the anonymous author of the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes reminded his listeners of the different times and seasons of life:

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens:
A time to be born and a time to die,
A time to plant and a time to uproot,
A time to kill and a time to heal,
A time to tear down and a time to build,
A time to weep and a time to laugh,
A time to mourn and a time to dance ..."
(Ecclesiastes 3, 1-4)

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity. Some are especially aware of this reality, due to the nature of their work.

For example, teachers and others working in an educational environment are conscious of time - both in the rhythm of each school day or term, and in the unfolding development of young lives over time.

Farmers and gardeners too are aware of how the changing seasons affects their labour on the land. And, of course, in our life together as churches, the liturgical calendar moves



us through the annual celebration of the principal festivals and holy days that remind us of the earthly lifetime of Jesus.

In a variety of ways, all of us find that our lives are marked by different times and seasons. And we also know something of life's rich and contrasting mixture of experiences to which the writer of Ecclesiastes refers: "a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance".

But is that it? In the end, does life only amount to "a time to be born and a time to die"? Not according to the Bible for, as Ecclesiastes puts it, God has "set eternity in the human heart". God has a purpose for us beyond the horizon of this life.

Christians believe it is through Jesus Christ - His birth, death and resurrection - that we are assured death is not the end. Jesus has broken down the barrier of sin and death, once and for all. Through Him we come to share in His life and experience the fulfilment of God's loving purposes, which lie beyond the times and seasons of our present life.



Purple for both Advent, (awaiting the birth of Christ) and Lent (40 days Jesus spent in the desert prior to his trial and death)

Gold for the Christmas and Epiphany (arrival of the Magi) seasons, and also for the Easter season.

Green for 'ordinary time' (usually a couple of weeks or so) between Epiphany and Lent, and later in the year for the long season of Trinity ... before coming round to Advent again.


